**CAPTAIN ASA LAY, AMERICAN REVOLUTIONARY WAR PATRIOT SAR GRAVEMARKING, OLD CEMETERY, WESTBROOK, CT. August 29, 2009, 3:00pm.**

The Lay family of Virginia, Richard Lay, Francis Lay, Dotty Lay & Jake & Betsy Lay traveled to Westbrook, CT to participate in the gravemarking of their 4th great grandfather ASA Lay. Assisting in the ceremony were the Westbrook Historical Society, led by Mrs. Sally Correll, President; the Col. Webb 7th Conn. Line SAR Color Guard, the CT Branch of the Bugles Across America organization, the Town of Westbrook First Selectman Noel Bishop, who paid tribute to Capt. Lay's Rev. War service, and the contributions of the Lay family to the early development of the town of Westbrook; and a member of the local Boy Scout Troup. The Historical Society members attended the ceremony in mass and developed a wealth of Lay genealogy for display in the society's headquarters and museum. They also hosted a coffee, tea & cake event at hqs. An added attraction was a trip by the Lay family to the Asa Lay house, the first house in Westbrook, built starting in 1699 by Asa's grandfather, Robert Lay, III.
